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

Dear Friends,



As we step from Summer into Fall, I am reminded of Shri Babaji words: "Now the season is changing....Summer is taking a step toward winter. The change in climate engenders chemical changes in the body...." Well, this month of September has certainly felt this way with so many changes going on. It began with the sweetest kindergarten and first grade children coming to the fire ceremony. One of the little boys was particularly taken by it all and even figured out how to blow the conch shell by the end of it. As he left he told me he liked this place and would like to return. When I inquired who he was, I found out that he was the grandson of Safiya, someone I knew from the Spiritual Alliance.

A few days later, there was a terrible traffic accident and this woman was killed. As I attended her cremation and we shared stories of Safiya, I was reminded of the fragility of life and made a vow to live each day to the fullest. I also saw her little grandson there and realized how Safiya's love and exuberance for life will be carried on through him and others that she has touched.

That week I also greeted a young man who had been to the Ashram before but this time he had to

be taken here by a friend since he could barely walk. He had been punctured through the stomach and lungs (just narrowly missing his heart) by a forklift. As we hugged, he just kept saying how grateful he was to be alive and that he wanted to come and thank the Divine Mother. Another woman who had just undergone emergency surgery for a gall bladder that had swollen to five times its size, made the Ashram her first outing to thank the Divine Mother for her life and to be among people who she felt nurtured by.

The next weekend I attended a gathering honoring Lorain Davis who had recently moved from Crestone after 30 years to Denver due to health reasons. (She turned seventy-five years old this summer.) About a hundred of us shared stories and our gratitude for a woman who had given so much to so many. Lorain, a Blackfoot Cree Native American, had led sweat lodges, attended Sun Dances, taught Native American Studies at Naropa University, and brought many Native American Elders to Crestone over the years. For the Ashram personally, she and her husband, David, had met Shri Babaji in 1979 and were very instrumental in organizing the first Babaji gatherings here in

Crestone in 1985 and 1986. They have both served on the Ashram Board of Directors. It was a poignant moment when she thanked everyone for coming and shared how deeply touched she was. She said that this kind of gathering should be held for people while they were alive, not just when they died. Of course my mind went immediately to the previous weekend's cremation and the different energy of both.

We also felt the enormous amount of rain that came to Colorado. We were blessed in Crestone to not have any flooding and could just appreciate all the life-giving moisture for our long drought thirsty trees. But we also felt the pain of others as we heard their stories of mudslides, flooding, loss of power, and other devastation. These are times when we are reminded of the power of Mother Nature.

I was also feeling some anxiousness over the preparations for Navratri. As I melted into my deeper realization that all would be taken care of by Babaji and Mother, Dora, our Native American friend walked into the earthship with her two beautiful grand daughters, Angel and Vanaiah. They are spending the school year here in Crestone with their Grandma and wanted to help at the Ashram. So for the last two Friday afternoons they have spent hours here helping with so many jobs making Navratri preparations fun and easy. But even more so, their sweet spirits, generous hearts, and interest in spiritual pursuits are so refreshing to see in an eighth and tenth grader.

As we rolled into this last weekend, we had our first freeze, lost many of our flowers and vegetables in the garden, noticed the ghee getting thick in the cold at our morning fire ceremonies, and watched the snow cover the top of the mountains. We also had many visitors, some old, treasured friends and many new friends who were deeply touched by their visits to the Ashram. A couple of the teenage visitors impressed me with their deep values and questions. I made a phone call to one of our dear older Indian friends who is in the final stages of cancer at his daughter's home back East and heard both the peace and the sadness in his voice and in the voice of his wife of 49 years. I also received a call from a woman in Gunnison who needed some hope and relief from her constant pain and organized a ride for her to come to Navratri for a few days.

Amidst all of this, we still managed to have a game of softball at the park last Sunday afternoon under a pristine blue sky and in perfect 70-degree weather. Good laughter (which our softball games generally have a lot of!) is a gift. I was particularly aware of this on the way home when I received a phone call from a friend who was in need of some companionship and talking, so off I went to spend the evening with her. Yesterday Jessica, Dora, Vanaiah and I spent the afternoon cleaning every nook and cranny of the temple getting ready for Navratri. I was exhausted and fell asleep like a baby at 8:30!

And so my life and emotions have felt a bit like a yo yo of change this past month. It has left me more deeply aware of how many people are suffering and in need, how much I have been given, and that there is also a lot of hope because of the deep faith and perseverance in people and the young folks who are growing up with a deeper sense of meaning of life.

Ceremonies and Schedule

The new-moon fire ceremony this month is on Friday, October 4 (the first day of Navratri with nine consecutive days of fire ceremonies) and the full-moon is on Friday, October 18. The fire ceremonies begin at 10am and are followed by a meal. Please arrive freshly bathed, in a long skirt or pants with shoulders covered, and having fasted from grains, cereals, meat, eggs, garlic and onions. (Fruit, yogurt, nuts, veggies and tea or coffee are fine to eat before. Also if you have

a dietary need for something more hardy before our meal at 11:30 or so, please partake.)

Our evening aarati is at 6pm and morning aarati is at 7am with a paduka puja in Shri Babaji's kutir each morning at 6:30am. Lunch is served at about 12:30 pm, and we invite you to join us. (Call if you are a group or have special dietary needs.) The Maha Lakshmi Shop is open every day from 10am until 5pm.

\$108 sponsorship - Rose Quartz Mala or a copper, silver, brass bracelet


